CITY OF DELRAY BEACH, FLORIDA FIRST EXTENSION OF EMERGENCY DECLARATION DATED APRIL 9, 2020 (USE OF MASKS BY RESIDENTS AND VISITORS)

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020 a State of Emergency was declared in the City of Delray Beach relating to the Novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19); and

WHEREAS, on April 9, 2020, City of Delray Beach City Manager George Gretsas executed Emergency Declaration of the City of Delray Beach, Florida, dated April 9, 2020 (the Order), requiring, *inter alia*, the use of masks by residents and visitors in grocery stores, convenience stores, retail establishments, pharmacies, retail food facilities, and restaurants as well as while performing construction activities on job sites; and

WHEREAS, the Order is scheduled to expire on May 1, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the spread of COVID-19 continues to seriously affect the safety and security of the lives of the citizens of Delray Beach and the public at large; and

WHEREAS, the widespread effects of COVID-19 continue to require extraordinary and immediate actions by the City of Delray Beach in order to protect the public health, safety, welfare and renders an extension of the Order necessary.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, George Gretsas, City Manager of the City of Delray Beach, Florida, pursuant to Section 95.05(A) of the Code of Ordinances, do hereby extend the Emergency Declaration of the City of Delray Beach, Florida, dated April 9, 2020 until 11:59 p.m. on Saturday, May 9, 2020. All parts of the Emergency Declaration of the City of Delray Beach, Florida, dated April 9, 2020 not expressly amended herein shall remain in full force and effect.
