After-school activities will be conducted over the course of 12 months for a maximum of eighty-two (82) unduplicated youth between the age of 12 and 18. This will be achieved by targeting the area's low income and minority youth who are in dire need of a safe, supervised and educational haven during non-school hours which is designed to help them stay in school, and graduate on time with a plan for the future whether it be post-secondary education, participation in a credentialed employment program or military service.

Housing education compared to the City and County, The Set has a much higher poverty rate. Sixty-three percent of residents' income falls at or below 200% of the Federal poverty line - \$24,600 for a family of four. Almost half of The Set population gualifies for Medicaid -47.7%. Development pressure exerted by the success of eastern Delray Beach has caused the median home prices in The Set to rise significantly faster than the County and City from. Between 2000 - 2015 census tract 67 experienced a 31% increase in housing prices. However, the overall median home price - \$156,599 is significantly lower compared to the City or County. Housing costs across Palm Beach County continue to rise affecting moderate to low-income households to a greater degree. Households within The Set paying more than 30% of annual income for housing costs is significantly higher relative to the City and County - 10% - 12%. 68% of renters in The Set are housing cost burdened.

EBLB Pop-up Produce: This program addresses food insecurity, lack of nutrition education, community health, while also providing a healthy food solution for those in food deserts with low income or no income at all. The Pop-Up Produce program is where we add a healthy eating component to a local community event. We do this by prepackaging a set number of produce bags to distribute at an event or providing a "farmers market" set up with bags and allow the patrons to fill a produce bag based on household size. For both set ups we will collect the numbers of individuals/households that we are serving for our data. The bags will include about 6-8 different fruits or vegetables that will last for about 2weeks minimum because it is freshly ordered. This is also a way for individuals to learn about our grocery assistance if they are truly food insecure. We will only partner with events catering to low income or moderate income families and we will identify that by working with the city of delray, parks and recreation, the housing authority and the nonprofit


