## **PROCLAMATION**

**WHEREAS**, Juneteenth is the oldest known celebration commemorating the ending of slavery in the United States.; and

**WHEREAS,** on June 19<sup>th</sup> that the Union soldiers, led by Major General Gordon Granger, landed at Galveston, Texas with news that the war had ended and that the enslaved were now free; and

**WHEREAS**, this was two and a half years after President Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation - which had become official January 1, 1863.; and

**WHEREAS**, the Emancipation Proclamation had little impact on the Texans due to the minimal number of Union troops to enforce the new Executive Order; and

**WHEREAS,** however, with the surrender of General Lee in April of 1865, and the arrival of General Granger's regiment, the forces were finally strong enough to influence and overcome the resistance.

**NOW, THEREFORE, I, THOMAS F. CARNEY, JR.**, Mayor of the City of Delray, Florida, on behalf of the City Commission, do hereby proclaim June 19th as:

## Juneteenth

in the City of Delray Beach.
