Mr. Moore introduced Stephen Emery from Citrin Cooperman Advisors, who was present to discuss his firm's business practices and answer questions from the Commission on their potential engagement to audit the City's Finance Department. Vice Mayor Casale shared her concerns about the practices and procedures of the City's Finance Department, which she indicated would be the main focus of Citron Cooperman's audit.

Mr. Emory discussed his company's business practices when conducting a forensic audit.

Mr. Moore thanked Mr. Emory for his time.

5.A.2. CODE ENFORCEMENT DIVISION

Jeff Oris, Assistant City Manager, presented an update on the City's Code Enforcement Division. He explained that the department collaborates closely with residents and business owners, and plans to work more closely with the Downtown Development Authority, the Community Redevelopment Agency, and other external organizations to ensure compliance with the City's codes and Land Development Regulations. Additionally, he mentioned the department is preparing to implement civil citations when necessary. He stated there has been a high turnover of Code Enforcement Officers, and training new hires takes time; therefore, cross-training efforts will be made.

The Commission discussed the proper protocol for homes and businesses that were repeatedly non-compliant with the City code.

She noted that the text amendment aligns with and advances the Comprehensive Plan's goals, objectives, and policies (GOP).
