6. Old Business

6a. Climate Action Plan

Kent reminded the group that the Climate Action Survey is active and any help getting it out to the public is appreciated. He stated that the target is 300 responses by end of September (currently just over 200).

Kent and Chris discussed some of the current results of the survey.

The group asked questions and suggested locations for the Climate Action Survey QR flyer.

6b. Education Initiatives

6bi. September/Climate & Culture/Restaurant Month

The group expressed that they like the new name "Climate and Culture".

Kent mentioned and new event "Climate and Cocktails" on September 6th. There was a very positive response to this idea. Evan mentions that Miami has a monthly climate happy hour that is very well attended.

Kent mentioned that on September 7th at Arts Warehouse there is an art event focused on climate change and sea level rise.

Kent mentions that the Spady Montessori coordinator is interested in having a presentation or a class field trip. Kent will work on setting up an event with The Reef Institute.

Evan mentioned a restaurant called "Brule" who may be interested in participating in a C&C event. "Ramen Lab" was also suggested to host an event.

6bii. Plastics

Evan commented on the "Balloon Bill" will most likely be vetoed.

6c. Legislative Issues

Evan explained that the Safe waterways act will likely pass. Melanie explained that there is budget cuts coming from arts across the state. It will likely affect larger museums. Evan asked if Delray Beach has a "Balloon Release Ordinance", if not to make a recommendation for putting one into effect.

Kent mentioned that the plastic industry has current advertising explaining some plastics are reusable over and over. Kent suggests that this would be good content for a memo to Commission in support of reaching out to industry to share what we would like to see from the plastic industry.

Kent mentioned that committees are starting in August. He informed the GIAB that it is time to start getting thoughts together on priorities for legislative sessions. He suggested that the board consider a memo in support of specific types of

legislation to be shared with commission.

- "Mylar Balloon Release Ordinance Memo". Evan suggested to make an ordinance similar to the bill that is currently likely to be vetoed. Protect children from being fined. Balloons are still allowed but not to be released.

Chris mentioned that there are 2 upcoming projects that likely will trigger the GBO requirements. He also laid out his vision for how the GBO could be revised to include benchmarking and HERS scores as well as a voluntary stretch code with an incentive of reduced bond.
