

RESOLUTION NO. 43-26

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF DELRAY BEACH, FLORIDA, RETROACTIVELY APPROVING A GRANT APPLICATION AND APPROVING A GRANT AGREEMENT WITH THE U.S. ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY PROVIDING FUNDING TO UPGRADE THE NORTH HIGH SERVICE PUMP STATION AND THE MILLER PARK HIGH SERVICE PUMP STATION IN THE AMOUNT OF \$4,412,729.00 WITH A REQUIRED COST-SHARE OF \$1,103,182.00 BY THE CITY; AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE ANY AMENDMENTS AND/OR RENEWALS AND TAKE ANY AND ALL ACTIONS NECESSARY TO EFFECTUATE THE INTENT OF THIS RESOLUTION; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the City of Delray Beach (“City”) is authorized to enter into agreements to provide services, programming, and products in accordance with its Charter; and

WHEREAS, the City plans to upgrade its water infrastructure by upgrading two high service pumps by replacing supporting equipment and control drives with more modern equipment; and

WHEREAS, the City applied for grant funding from the U.S. Environment Protection Agency (“EPA”) for the water system improvements on October 10, 2025; and

WHEREAS, the EPA sent notice of a grant award to provide 80 percent funding for the project in the amount of \$4,412,729.00 with a cost-share requirement from the City in the amount of \$1,103,182.00; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission deems approval of this Resolution to be in the best interest of the health, safety, and welfare of the residents and citizens of the City of Delray Beach and the public at large.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF DELRAY BEACH, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are hereby affirmed and ratified.

Section 2. The City Commission of the City of Delray Beach has reviewed and hereby retroactively provides approval to apply for grant funding and approves the Agreement between the City and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, which is attached to this Resolution as Exhibit A.

Section 3. The City Commission authorizes the City Manager to execute any amendments and/or renewals thereto and take any other actions necessary to effectuate the intent of this resolution.

Section 4. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon adoption.
