Point-in-Time & Housing Inventory Count



- The *Point-In-Time (PIT)* Count is a count of sheltered and unsheltered people experiencing homelessness on a single night in January.
 - Unsheltered individuals are recorded homeless if they were surveyed during the 24 hour PIT count timeframe.
 - Two types of surveys were used for the PIT Count: Observed and Interviewed.
 - Observed: Any individual who declined an interviewed survey, and was determined by the surveyor to be "definitely" homeless.
 - Interviewed: Individuals who agreed to answer an array of questions about their current homeless situation.
 - Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) requires that Continuums of Care (CoC) conduct an annual count of people experiencing homelessness who are sheltered in emergency shelters, transitional housing, and safe havens on a single night.
 - The Housing Inventory Count (HIC) is a point-in-time inventory of provider programs within a CoC that provides beds and units dedicated to serving people experiencing homelessness; categorized by five program types: Emergency Shelter, Transitional Housing, Rapid Re-housing, Safe Haven, and Permanent Supportive Housing.
 - Palm Beach County PIT Count took place from noon on Thursday, January 30th, 2025 to noon on Friday, January 31st, 2025.
 - The CoC along with Palm Beach County employees and volunteers divided into groups to cover all of PBC (geographically) to count individuals experiencing homelessness within a 24-hour period.





PIT – Sheltered Count 2025



- 606 persons sheltered.
- 466 persons in Emergency Shelter.
- 140 persons in Transitional Housing.



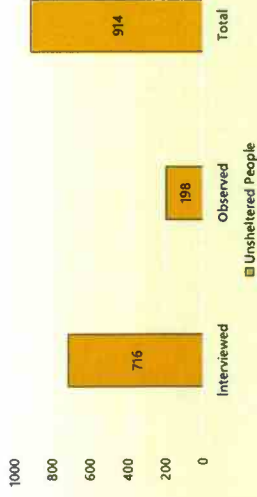
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PIT – Unsheltered Count 2025



- 914 unsheltered individuals and families experiencing homelessness were counted during the 2025 PIT Count.
- 716 Homeless interview surveys conducted.
- 198 Observation surveys were conducted.



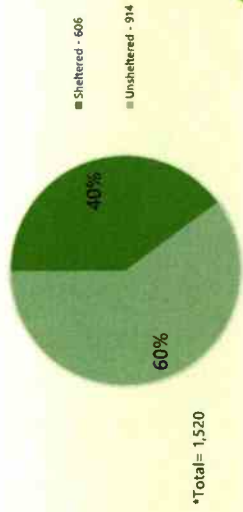
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2025 PIT Count – Sheltered/Unsheltered

- The chart below shows the number of homeless individuals and families counted in sheltered/unsheltered locations.
- Sheltered** – Individuals and families that reside in Emergency Shelter, Transitional Housing programs, or Safe Havens.
- Unsheltered** – Individuals and families that reside in a place not meant for habitation (i.e., abandoned building, vehicle, camp-site).

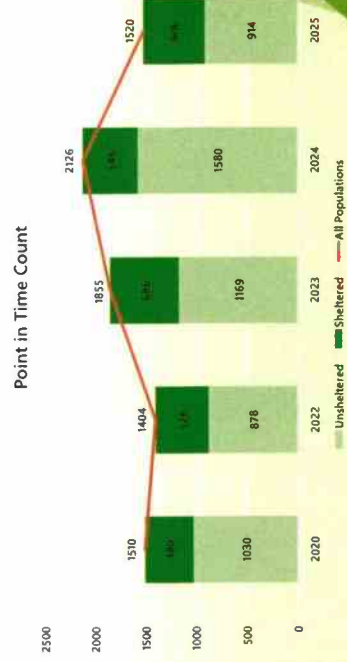


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PIT Count – Unsheltered vs Sheltered

- The chart below shows how many "Unsheltered" and "Sheltered" individuals and families were counted during the past five PIT Counts.

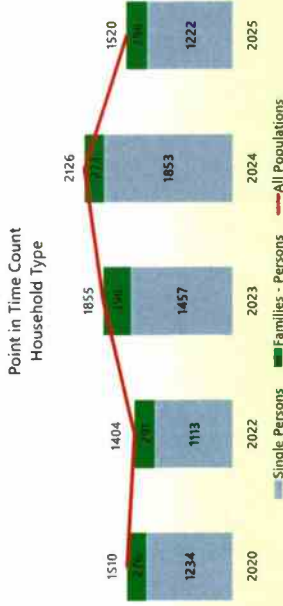


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2025 PIT Count – Household Type

- The graph below shows how many "Individuals" and "Families" were surveyed in the last five PIT Counts.
- A few key notes from the data below:
 - Individuals decreased by 635 persons from 2024 to 2025.
 - Families increased by 29 persons from 2024 to 2025.
 - The overall PIT Count decreased by 606 total persons from 2024 to 2025.



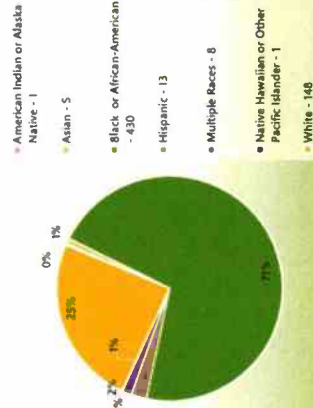
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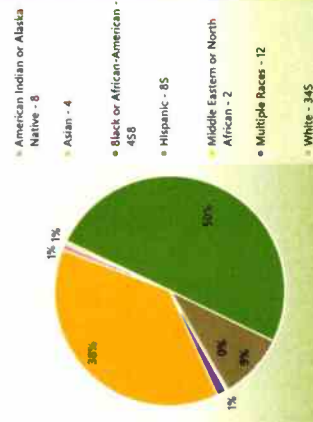
2025 PIT Count – Race

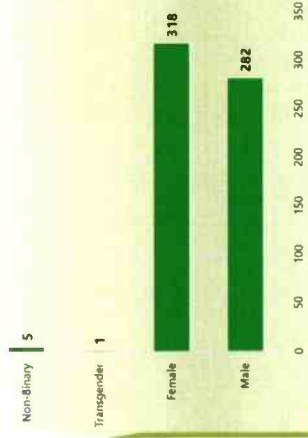
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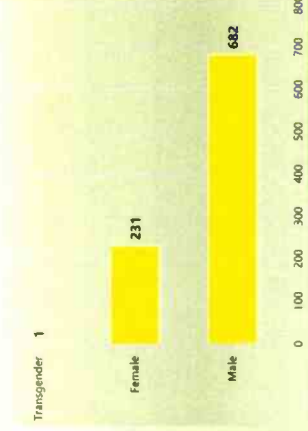
2025 PIT Count –Gender Identity

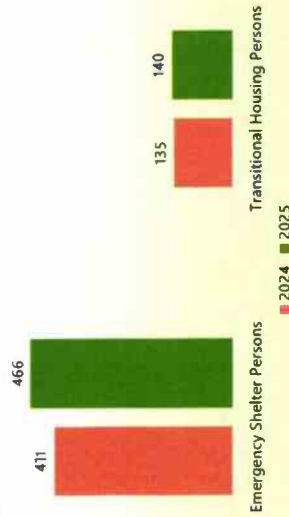
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2024 to 2025 Emergency Sheltered persons to Transitional Housing persons

- The charts below compare the amount of sheltered individuals and families in Emergency Shelter and Transitional Housing in 2024 vs. 2025.

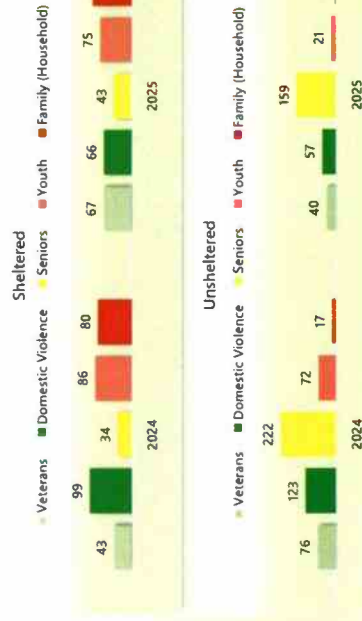


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2024 to 2025 PIT Count – Subpopulations

- The graphs below show the subpopulations for both Sheltered and Unsheltered individuals and families in the 2024 and 2025 PIT Count.
- One subpopulation that saw a significant increase from 2024 to 2025 is Unsheltered Seniors numbers, which decreased from 222 persons to 159 persons.

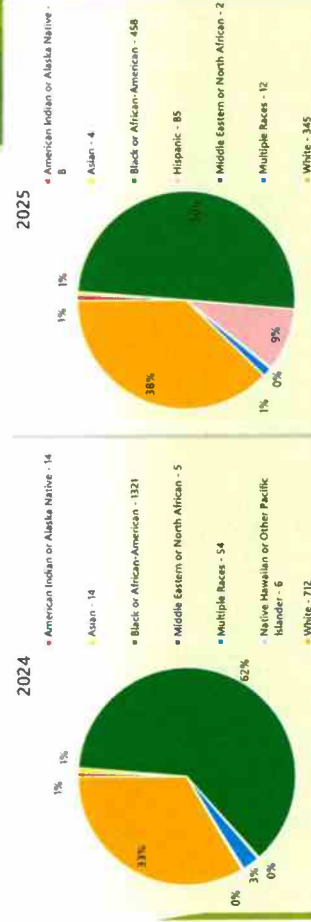


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2024 to 2025 PIT Count by Race

- The pie charts below represent the race of individuals and families that were counted in the 2024 and 2025 PIT count.
- A few key notes from the data below are:
 - From 2024 to 2025 there was a noticeable decrease of all individuals and families between the 2024 and 2025 PIT Count with a noticeable decrease in Black or African-Americans.

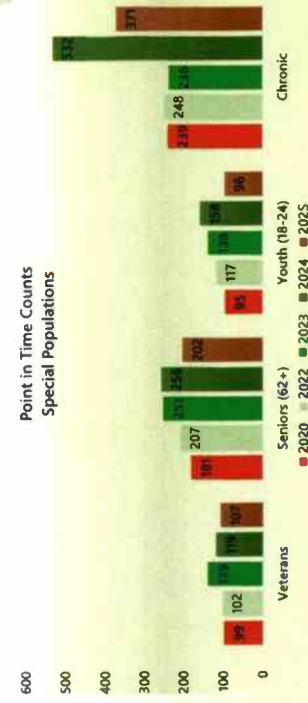


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2020-2025 PIT Special Populations

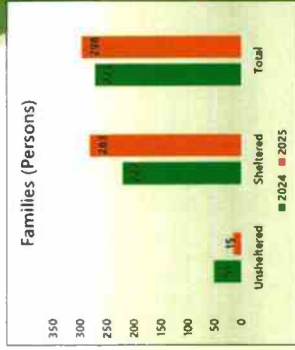
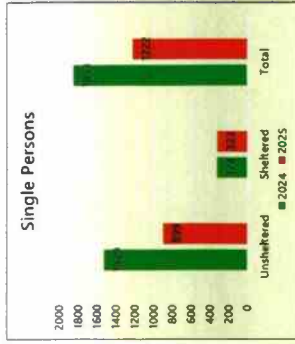


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2024 and 2025 PIT Count of Individuals and Families

- The bar graphs below represent the total number of individuals and family persons categorized by unsheltered and sheltered that were counted during the 2024 and 2025 PIT Count.

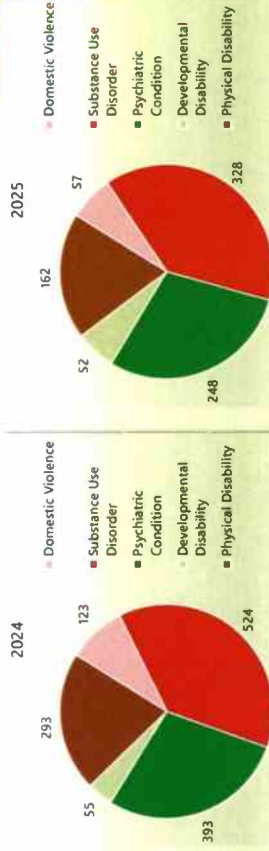


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2024 and 2025 PIT Count Unsheltered Health Conditions

- The unsheltered pie charts represent how many individuals and families self-identified as having one or more health conditions during the 2024 and 2025 PIT Counts.
- The data below suggests that self-identifying health conditions rose from 2023 to 2024 in most categories, but the largest increase was Substance Use Disorder which rose from 128 individuals and families in 2023 to 601 in 2024.

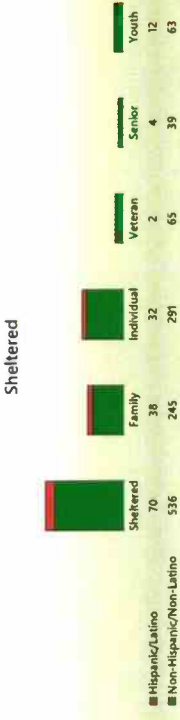
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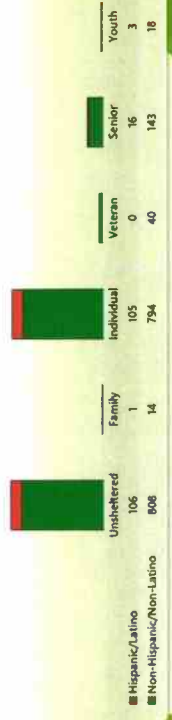
2025 PIT Count– Ethnicity & Subpopulation

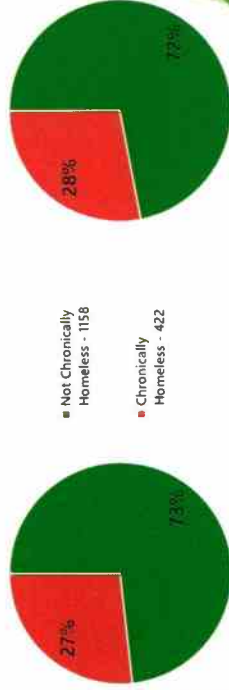
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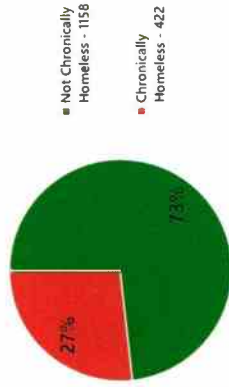
2024 and 2025 PIT Count Unsheltered – Chronic Homelessness

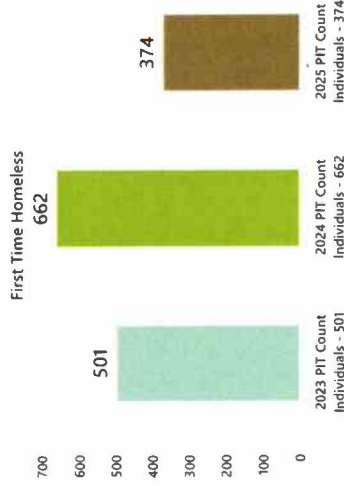


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2023 - 2025 PIT Count Unsheltered – First-Time Homeless

- The graph below compares the totals of self-identified first-time homeless individuals and families from the 2023 PIT Count to the 2025 PIT Count.



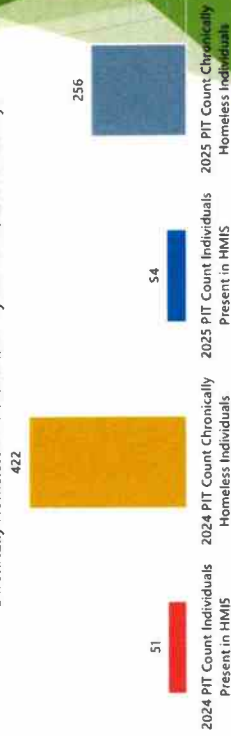
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2024 and 2025 Chronically Homeless Individuals comparison to HMIS
