







SITE AERIAL MAP

## Masonry Modern Style


The Masonry Modern style is characteristic of a rationally organized, load bearing structure with limited ornamentation. It is reminiscent of Modern buildings and also incorporates adaptations for the climate of South Florida.

The design of this 4 story development is based on the Masonry Modern guidelines of Delray Beach which highlights the solidity of the building and a predominance of a mass carved with deep terraces and recessed windows. The building is crowned with a sunshade eyebrow to create shaded outdoor living areas. Solidity is also reinforced by the rationality of the structure, the rhythmic repetition of columns, and the articulation of all building parts. The building entrance is highlighted with a canopy that embraces the corner of NE 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue and NE 2<sup>nd</sup> Street.

The proposed building design's harmonious color palate and spectacular terraces pays homage to Delray Beach's urban fabric. This integration will ensure visual compatibility with buildings in the vicinity and with the fabric of Downtown Delray Beach. The style has been carefully designed to complement and enhance the existing buildings in the area as it considers the scale, proportion and materials used in neighboring structures.

The Link's good proportions, elegant detailing, and sensitivity to the surrounding context will produce a beautiful composition and elevate the architectural expression of the area.

# Masonry Modern Style Delray Beach Architectural Guidelines



The upper part of building is marked with special features such as rooftop terraces or sculptural stairwell roofs.  
Parapet wall extends to enclose accessible roof terrace.

Window proportion is vertical, when aggregated, the masonry opening can be square or horizontal; divided lites can create square or vertical proportions.

Composition of building reflects solidity of structural system, uses simple geometries, and includes spaces carved from the mass to create entries or terraces.

Smooth stucco; precast and stone are also appropriate.

Railings are metal, wood, or extensions of solid walls.

Eyebrows, terraces, arcades, or deep roof overhangs provide shade.

Entrance to building is clearly identifiable.

Like more classically inspired buildings, the Modern Masonry building has an articulated base, middle, and top.

# Masonry Modern Style Proposed Design

- Flat roofs that are utilized for terraces with parapet walls that extend to enclose an accessible roof terrace.
- Composition of building reflects solidity of structural system, uses simple geometries, and includes spaces carved from the mass to create entries or terraces.
- Window types are casement and fixed.
- Window proportion is vertical and the windows are recessed from the face of the exterior producing shadows and revealing the thickness of the wall.
- Exterior finishes are stucco with colors referencing Art Deco- primarily whites with greens to highlighting details and darker gray to highlight the base of the building.
- Recess terraces and eyebrows provide shaded outdoor spaces.
- Railings are metal and glass or extended parapet walls.
- Entrance to building is clearly identifiable
- The geometry of the building appears to be carved from a solid volume
- Building has tripartite composition (lower, middle, upper)
