



Business Impact Estimate

ORDINANCE NO. 21-24: AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF DELRAY BEACH, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE LAND DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS OF THE CITY OF DELRAY BEACH CODE OF ORDINANCES CHAPTER 2, "ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS," ARTICLE 2.6, "NOTICE REQUIREMENTS," SECTION 2.6.3, "REQUIRED PUBLIC NOTICE," BY ENACTING A NEW SUBSECTION (H), "WAIVERS" TO ADD PUBLIC NOTICE REQUIREMENTS FOR WAIVER REQUESTS THAT REQUIRE CITY COMMISSION APPROVAL, PROVIDING A CONFLICTS CLAUSE; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AUTHORITY TO CODIFY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Business Impact Estimate is provided in accordance with section 166.041(4), Florida Statutes. - c. Section 553.73, Florida Statutes, relating to the Florida Building Code; or
- d. Section 633.202, Florida Statutes, relating to the Florida Fire Prevention Code.

In accordance with the provisions of controlling law, the City of Delray Beach hereby publishes the following information:

1. Summary of the proposed ordinance (must include a statement of the public purpose, such as serving the public health, safety, morals and welfare):

The proposed ordinance would require public notice requirements prior to Commission hearing of a request for approval of a waiver from the Land Development Regulations. This provides the public an opportunity to comment on development requests that may have an adverse impact.

2. An estimate of the direct economic impact of the proposed ordinance on private, for-profit businesses in the City of Delray Beach, if any:

- (a) An estimate of direct compliance costs that businesses may reasonably incur;
- (b) Any new charge or fee imposed by the proposed ordinance or for which businesses will be financially responsible; and
- (c) An estimate of the City of Delray Beach's regulatory costs, including estimated revenues from any new charges or fees to cover such costs.

Any business that requests a waiver from development regulations would be required to pay postage to send notice to the properties within 500 feet of the subject property. A \$100 fee for each public notice placard would be required.

3. Good faith estimate of the number of businesses likely to be impacted by the proposed ordinance:

Unknown. Waivers from development regulations are not required; those who decide to pursue a waiver will have to pay for the public notice mailer and placards.
