MOU with SEIU

Duane D' Andrea, Human Resources Manager, shared the results of the negotiations between the City and the Service Employees International Union (SEIU).The minimum starting pay rate increased to \$15.32 per hour. He added the financial impact would be \$212,000 in salary adjustments, which had been budgeted in the departments that have SEIU-represented employees.

Mayor Petrolia voiced her concern about negotiating pay structures out of their time frame.
