


Community Partnerships

Helping Families Overcome Obstacles in Our Community

- Working families across the country pay a significant percentage of their annual earnings to cover the price of childcare
- The cost of living in Delray Beach is significantly higher than the national average and is ranked 7 out of 125 for the most expensive cities in Florida
- 30% of ACCF families fall below the Federal Poverty Level
- Many of ACCF's families and teachers cannot afford to live in this community
