

Maintenance

1. Regular Inspections

Frequency: Twice a year (preferably in spring and fall)

Action: Perform a thorough inspection of the mural to identify any signs of wear, fading, or damage. Pay particular attention to areas exposed to harsh sunlight, rain, or high traffic.

2. Touch-Ups

Frequency: As needed (usually every 1–3 years depending on exposure)

Action: If fading or minor damage occurs, touch up the mural using the same high-quality paint originally applied. The absence of an anti-graffiti coating makes these touch-ups easier and more seamless.

3. Graffiti Removal

Frequency: As needed

Action: If graffiti appears, remove it promptly using gentle, non-abrasive methods to minimize damage. For small marks, a diluted cleaner or soft sponge can work. For larger graffiti, consider professional help to ensure the mural is not harmed..

4. Professional Touch-Ups and Restorations

Frequency: Every 5–10 years, or as needed

Action: After long exposure, professional restoration may be required for significant wear or damage. A daily rate at a minimum but not limited to \$1,000.00 per day plus other expenses such as paint and lift rental.
