2024 TaxRoll Preliminary Media

The July 25, 2024, Special Meeting was called to order at 1:02 p.m. City Clerk, Katerri Johnson, called the roll, and the following were present:

Present: 5 - Mayor Thomas F. Carney, Jr., Vice Mayor Juli Casale, Deputy Vice Mayor Rob Long, Commissioner Angela Burns, and Commissioner Tom Markert

Others present were: Terrence Moore - City Manager Lynn Gelin - City Attorney

Mr. Moore delivered a presentation that compared the millage rates for fiscal year 2024 from neighboring municipalities, as provided by the Palm Beach County Property Appraiser's office. He compared the proposed millage rate of 6.0611 with a rollback rate of 5.9063 after attaining department considerations.

Sam Metott, Director of Parks and Recreation; Missie Barletto, Director of Public Works; Police Chief Russ Mager; and Assistant Fire Chief Green presented their departments' adjusted budgets.

Mr. Moore stated the majority of the Commission had informed him that maintaining the level of service that the City's residents expected was their top priority.

Mayor Carney opened the floor to public comments on this item.

Montre Bennett: 323 NW 2 Avenue, Delray Beach Provided his thoughts on the budget.

<u>Stephaine Immelman</u>, CEO of the Delray Beach Chamber of Commerce Applauded the Commission for their efforts to lower the millage rate.

<u>Christina Morrison</u>, 1000 Lowery Street, Delray Beach Discussed relieving the tax burden on residents through partnerships.

Debra Walker: 1312 NW 2 Street, Delray Beach

Stated part-time residents should pay a higher millage rate.

Michael Weiner: No address given

Supported the Commission in its efforts to prevent annual millage rate increases.

Seeing no one else present, Mayor Carney closed public comments.

The Commission provided feedback on the presentations. They emphasized the importance of maintaining service levels for residents and visitors and shared their suggestions for revenue-generating ideas for the City. They asked for clarification from the Police and Fire Department on how the lower millage rate would affect their departments.

Police Chief Mager and Assistant Fire Chief Green explained that reducing their budgets would negatively impact the City.

Mayor Carney suggested that once the budget was complete, there may be additional ways to lower the millage rate.

Mayor Carney passed the gavel to Vice Mayor Casale. A motion was made by Mayor Carney to accept the rollback millage rate of 5.9063, seconded by Vice Mayor Casale. A roll call vote was taken, and the motion carried by the following vote:
