LDR Section 2.1.9(B) - At least five seats on the Board must be filled with either an architect, landscape architect, civil engineer, general contractor, historian, preservationist, land planner, archaeologist, cultural anthropologist, museum curator, or conservationist. The remaining two seats shall be at large. Laypersons with knowledge, experience and judgment who have an interest in historic preservation shall make up the balance of the Board.

The appointing body shall endeavor to appoint as many of the required disciplines as possible to the Board to ensure compliance with the requirements of the City's designation as a Certified Local Government by the State of Florida. Preference should be given to professional and laypersons who own property within historic districts or whose property is individually listed in the Local Register of Historic Places.
