# 7. CHIEF OF POLICE UPDATE:

Chief Mager provided the board with an update on Part One Crimes.

- Year-to-date comparison of crime in 2024 vs. 2023:
  - homicides decreased by 66.67%
  - $\circ$  robberies have decreased by 50%
  - burglaries decreased by 49%
  - auto thefts decreased by 35.53%
  - o overall, persons crime decreased by 52.63% and property crime decreased by 49.21% in 2024 vs. 2023 year-to-date
- In comparison to July of 2023 vs. July of 2024:
  - $\circ$  homicides decreased by 100%
  - $\circ$  sex crimes have decreased by 40%
  - robberies decreased by 85.71%
  - o aggravated assaults decreased by 28.57%
  - overall persons crime decreased by 44.12%
  - $\circ$  burglaries remained the same (10)
  - o larceny decreased by 22.60%
  - motor vehicle theft decreased by 21.05%
  - overall property crime decreased by 49.21%
  - o overall, the total crime decreased by 24.58%
- There were 154 adult arrests, and 14 juvenile arrests initiated in July of 2024.

The department was short staffed by 20 officers last year, so the decrease in crime could be attributed to additional staffing and high visibility.

Members of the board reviewed the brochure with recommended changes and presented to the board for approval. A motion was made to approve the brochure as presented, with the provision that the pictures will be swapped as needed. Motion made by Mr. Strasser, seconded by Ms. Stacey-Wright.
