RESOLUTION NO. 154-20

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF DELRAY BEACH, FLORIDA, CONFIRMING A DECLARATION OF A STATE OF EMERGENCY; PROVIDING FOR THE RE-OPENING OF TATTOOING, BODY PIERCING, AND TANNING ESTABLISHMENTS CONSISTENT WITH PALM BEACH COUNTY COVID-19 ORDER NUMBER 2020-022; PROVIDING A CONFLICTS CLAUSE, AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, Governor Ron Desantis issued Executive Order 20-52 declaring a state of emergency for the State of Florida as a result of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, Palm Beach County declared a local State of Emergency due to the Coronavirus pandemic, which has been extended in accordance with applicable law; and

WHEREAS, on the same date, a State of Emergency in the City of Delray Beach was proclaimed by the City Commission, which has been extended twenty-five times due to the spread of the Novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19); and

WHEREAS, Palm Beach County is in Full Phase 1 pursuant to Executive Order 20-123 issued by Governor Desantis providing for, *inter alia*, the limited reopening of certain businesses as well as the phased restart of certain recreational activities; and

WHEREAS, on August 31, 2020, the Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners through its County Administrator issued Emergency Order 2020-022, allowing for the reopening of tattooing, body piercing, and tanning establishments with appropriate safety guidelines as outlined by the Florida Department of Health; and

WHEREAS, Palm Beach County experienced a sharp increase in the number of positive COVID-19 cases in May, June, and July and numerous virus control strategies were employed to slow the spread of the virus; and

WHEREAS, the City of Delray Beach recognizes that interventions such as facial covering directives and social distancing mandates provide the necessary safeguards for the safe reopening of certain business establishments; and

WHEREAS, consistent with Palm Beach County EO 2020-022, the City of Delray Beach determines that the necessary plans are in place for the safe reopening of tattooing, body piercing, and tanning establishments in accordance with the safety guidelines provided by the Florida Department of Health; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 95 of the City of Delray Beach Code of Ordinances authorizes the City Manager to take necessary measures in order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Delray Beach and the public at large; and

WHEREAS, the City of Delray Beach wishes to adopt, by reference, Palm Beach County Emergency Order 2020-022 allowing for the reopening of tattooing, body piercing, and tanning establishments.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF DELRAY BEACH, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1</u>. A declaration of a State of Emergency proclaimed on March 13, 2020 is hereby confirmed.

<u>Section 2</u>. The City of Delray Beach hereby adopts and incorporates by reference Palm Beach County Emergency Order Number 2020-22 dated August 31, 2020, attached hereto as **Exhibit A**.

<u>Section 3</u>. Tattooing, body piercing, and tanning establishments may operate with appropriate safety guidelines as outlined by the Florida Department of Health.

<u>Section 4</u>. This Resolution does not affect or limit the operations of Palm Beach County, the Palm Beach County School District, or any State or Federal office or facility.

<u>Section 5</u>. Any provision(s) within this Resolution that conflict with any state or federal law or constitutional provision, or conflicts with, or are superseded by, a current or subsequently issued Executive Order of the Governor or President of the United States, shall be deemed inapplicable and deemed to be severed from this Resolution, with the remainder of the Resolution remaining intact and in full force and effect.

<u>Section 6</u>. In addition to the enforcement provisions listed in Palm Beach County Emergency Orders Number 2020-022 and 2020-017, violations of the provisions of this Resolution shall be subject to enforcement pursuant to Chapter 95 of the Delray Beach Code of Ordinances.

<u>Section 7</u>. This Resolution shall be effective in accordance with Palm Beach County Emergency Order Number 2020-022 and shall expire upon the expiration of the existing State of Local Emergency declared on March 13, 2020, as same may be extended by subsequent order or declaration, unless earlier terminated.

EMERGENCY ORDER NUMBER 22 PALM BEACH COUNTY COVID-19 TANNING, TATTOOING, AND BODY PIERCING

WHEREAS, COVID-19, a respiratory illness caused by a virus that spreads rapidly from person to person and may result in serious illness or death, constitutes a clear and present threat to the lives, health, welfare, and safety of the people of Palm Beach County; and

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, Governor Ron DeSantis, issued Executive Order 20-52 declaring a state of emergency for the State of Florida as a result of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, pursuant to Section 252.38(3)(a)(5), Florida Statutes, Palm Beach County declared a local State of Emergency due to the Coronavirus pandemic, which has since been extended in accordance with applicable law; and

WHEREAS, on March 24, 2020, Governor Ron DeSantis also issued Executive Order 20-83 directing the State Surgeon General and the State Health Officer to issue a public health advisory for senior persons and persons that have a serious underlying medical condition that places them at a high risk of severe illness from COVID-19 to stay at home. Such conditions include, but are not limited to, chronic lung disease or moderate to severe asthma; serious heart conditions; immunocompromised status, including those in cancer treatment; and severe obesity; and

WHEREAS, Governor Ron DeSantis has issued a number of subsequent Executive Orders in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, including Executive Order 20-112, a Phase 1: Safe Smart Step-by-Step Plan for Florida's Recovery, under which the Governor re-opened certain businesses; Executive Order 20-120 which, among other things, served to include Palm Beach County under Phase 1; and Executive Order 20-123, in which the Governor extended and brought all Florida counties into Full Phase 1; and

WHEREAS, the County Administrator pursuant to the authorities cited below has issued various Emergency Orders, including Emergency Order 2020-005, effective April 29, 2020, as amended by Emergency Order 2020-007, effective May 18, 2020, and Emergency Order 2020-011, effective June 11, 2020, providing for the phased restart of boating and marine activities, golf courses, public and private parks, natural areas, tennis courts and community pools; and

WHEREAS, Governor Ron DeSantis in Executive Order 20-131 modified Executive Order 20-123 to allow organized youth activities to operate, including youth sports teams and leagues, youth clubs and programs, child care, summer camps, and youth recreation camps; and

WHEREAS, Palm Beach County experienced a sharp increase in the number of positive cases of COVID-19 in late May, June and July and numerous virus control strategies, including but not limited to, restrictions on business operations and events, facial covering and social distancing mandates, cleaning and hygiene requirements, testing, and public education, were employed to slow the spread of the virus; and

WHEREAS, given the above-mentioned interventions, the necessary plans are in place for the safe reopening of tattooing, body piercing, and tanning establishments, and, as such, Palm Beach County has obtained approval from the Governor's office to reopen said establishments in accordance with the safety guidelines provided by the Florida Department of Health.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED pursuant to Palm Beach County Code Chapter 9, Article II, Section 9-35, as well as the authorities granted to me by Declaration of Emergency issued by Governor DeSantis in Executive Order 20-52, by Chapter 252, Florida Statutes, by the Board of County Commissioners, by the Palm Beach County Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan, and as otherwise provided by law, I hereby order as follows:

- 1. The foregoing recitals are hereby incorporated herein by reference.
- 2. This Order applies in all incorporated and unincorporated areas of Palm Beach County.
- 3. As of the effective date of this order, tattooing, body piercing, and tanning establishments may operate with appropriate safety guidelines as outlined by the Florida Department of Health.
- 4. The Sheriff of Palm Beach County, other law enforcement agencies including municipal law enforcement agencies, and any other personnel authorized by law, including, but not limited to, the personnel described in Section 9-37 of the Palm Beach County Code of Ordinances, are authorized to enforce this order in accordance with the provisions of Emergency Order 2020-017, and any subsequent amendments thereto.
- 5. Any provision(s) within this order that conflict(s) with any state or federal law or constitutional provision, or conflict(s) with, or are superseded by, a current or subsequently-issued Executive Order of the Governor or the President of the United States, shall be deemed inapplicable and deemed to be severed from this order, with the remainder of the order remaining intact and in full force and effect. To the extent application of some or all of the provisions of this order is prohibited on the sovereign land of a federally or state recognized sovereign or Indian tribe, such application is expressly excluded from this order. The provisions of this order shall supersede the specific provisions of any previously issued County Emergency Order that is contrary to or in conflict with this order.

6. This order shall be effective as of 12:01 a.m. on August 31, 2020. This order shall expire upon the expiration of the existing State of Local Emergency, as same may be extended by subsequent order or declaration, unless earlier terminated by subsequent order.
