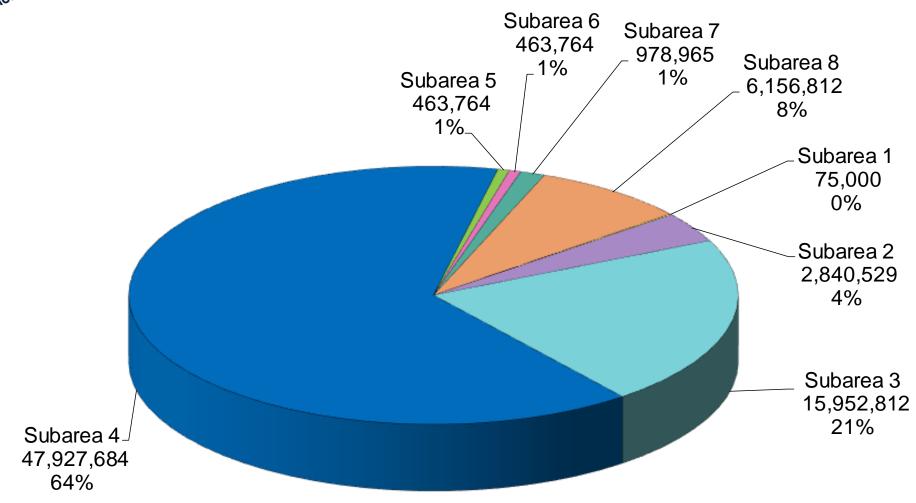

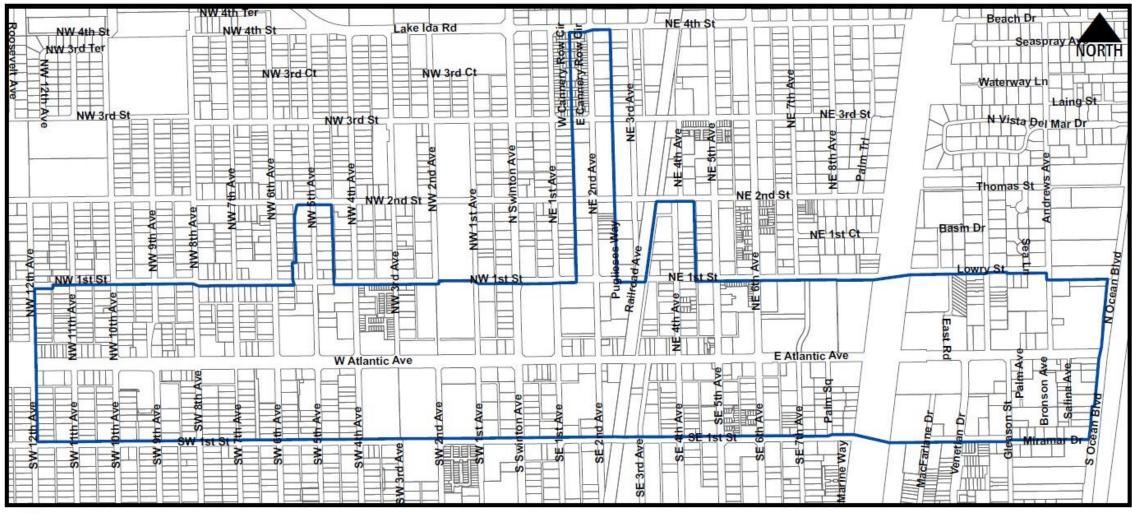

Live Local Act – Update Properties for Disposal



- ➤ On March 29, 2023, the Live Local Act (SB 102) was signed into law and became effective July 1, 2023.
- Sections 4 and 7 of the Bill amends Sections 125.379 and 166.0451, Florida Statutes.
- ➤ The language states that by October 1, 2023, and every 3 years thereafter, each county and municipality shall prepare an inventory list of all real property within its jurisdiction to which the county or municipality or any dependent special district within its boundaries holds fee simple title which is appropriate for use as affordable housing.
