1. ROLL CALL

The Regular City Commission Meeting was called to order at 5:05 p.m. City Clerk, Alexis Givings, called the role, and the following were present:

4.A. A PRESENTATION ON THE LIVE LOCAL ACT AND BRIEF REVIEW OF THE LIVE LOCAL PROJECT SUBMITTED FOR 2101 SOUTH CONGRESS AVENUE.

Anthea Gianniotes, Development Services Director, provided an overview of the Live Local Act and an update on the project submitted. She identified the requirements for development and the administrative approval process, discussed preemptive land use zoning and the proposal for Alton Delray, and described the architectural plans for the project. She noted that once the project is approved and if the project meets the standards of the Act, then it would not come before the Commission as an appealable.

Vice Mayor Casale spoke about the preemption and being a home rule state. She suggested the City send a letter to the State Legislature expressing concerns.

There was discussion regarding the parking spaces. Ms. Gianniotes stated

the parking has been addressed.

Deputy Vice Mayor Long suggested contacting the Florida League of Cities to voice any concerns.

There was consensus among the Commission to draft a letter. Mr. Moore stated he would begin working closely with Mat Forrest to write a letter addressed to the Florida League of Cities and the State Legislature outlining concerns related to the Live Local Act.

5.A.3. SMALL NON-PROFIT SPECIAL EVENTS WAIVER.

Jeff Oris, Assistant City Manager, explained the purpose of the waiver and outlined the total cost limits and qualifications for granting it. He described the process for presenting the waiver to the Commission for approval and suggested some limits.

Discussion ensued regarding the limits, number of events and the size of the non-profit organizations, clarifying terms.

Mayor Carney suggested having a ceiling versus the total number of events.

Mr. Oris emphasized the events must serve the residents and not the non-profits.

Deputy Vice Mayor Long stated each waiver request should come before the Commission. Mr. Oris explained that the requests would go to the Development Services Management Group (DSMG) for recommendation and then to the Commission for approval.

Vice Mayor Casale suggested obtaining a consensus via email to prevent applicants from appearing before the Commission for approval, thereby avoiding an awkward situation for the Commission.

Mr. Oris recommended having a \$10,000 ceiling for a particular grant per year.

There was a consensus to move forward with the special events waiver.

5.A.4. CONSIDERATIONS REGARDING GRANT POLICY FORMATION AND ADMINISTRATION

Janai Bowens, Education and External Opportunities Manager, provided a presentation regarding how grant funds are distributed. She explained that each city department was responsible for identifying its own needs. After this assessment, lobbyists collaborate with the departments to determine available grant opportunities.

Discussion ensued regarding creating an internal grant-writing policy to centralize funding for each nonprofit.

Mr. Moore stated he was working with Chief Financial Officer, Henry Dachowitz, to develop policy considerations for the 2025-26 budget.

The Commission thanked Ms. Bowen for her efforts.
