Gary Eliopoulos with GE Architecture was present on behalf of his client, who was requesting a small-scale amendment to the Land Use Map. The request was to change the 200 SE 7th Avenue property from Community Facilities (CF) to Low Density (LD). He noted that the property had been a vacant Church for many years. Mr. Eliopoulos stated his firm was proposing adaptive reuse from a Church to a single-family residence.

Anthea Gianniotes provided a staff report on this item. She reported the

structure would be retained with either land use designation.

Mayor Carney opened the floor to public comments on this item.

<u>Leanna Ferrin</u>, Realtor - specializes in historic properties in Delray Beach Discussed the owner's desire to convert the property into a private residence rather than a community facility. She mentioned that for fifty years, it was used as a Church.

<u>Roger Copa</u>: An Architect in the Historic District of Delray Beach Requested the applicant's request be denied.

<u>Claudia Willis</u>: 42 Palm Square, Delray Beach Stated that she was opposed to rezoning the property.

<u>John Szakal</u>: 214 SE 7 Avenue, Delray Beach Favored adopting the new zoning designation.

<u>Anne Whitehead</u>: 213 SE 7 Avenue, Delray Beach Would like to see the current structure preserved, as referenced in the City's Comprehensive Plan.

<u>Christina Morrison</u>: 1000 Lowery Street, Delray Beach Requested the Commission keep the current zoning as it stands for this property.

<u>Sandy Zeller</u>: 209 NW 12 Street, Delray Beach Favored keeping the property as it is.

<u>Sheryl Forman</u>: 200 SE 7 Street, Delray Beach, (Owner of the Church) She supported the rezoning of the Church but stated she would preserve its original structure as much as possible.

Seeing no one else present, Mayor Carney closed public comments.

Mayor Carney asked if there was any rebuttal for Item No. 8.C.

Jeff Costello, Planner - Planner with JC Planning, Delray Beach Commented that the proposed rezoning is in compliance with the Comprehensive Plan, specifically the Historic Preservation Element.

Anthea Gianniotes shared the staff's considerations for allowing adaptive reuses of the property.

A motion was made by Vice-Mayor Casale, seconded by Commissioner Markert, that this Ordinance be denied. The motion carried by the following vote:
