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## **DESCRIPTION OF PHYSICAL APPEARANCE PRIOR TO IMPROVEMENTS**

This was a one-story hipped roof, painted stucco building, with arched window surrounds, irregular in shape was constructed circa 1928. It featured a shouldered chimney stack with an exterior offset. The pitched barrel tile roof had exposed rafter tails.

The Mediterranean Revival Style wood frame building had a continuous concrete block foundation and a barrel tile pitched roof.

The main entrance was at the end of a walkway that led to concrete steps with metal railings and a small portico open porch with two Corinthian order porch columns.

Inside the main entrance was a living room with large concave crown molding and chimney. There were three sets of double hung glass French doors with mutins in that room. The first led to a Florida room that featured 3 arched windows on one wall and two arched windows on the other. The second led to a bedroom and the third led to a dining room which had a set of French doors that led to a small, metal railed, tiled porch. Beyond the dining room was a kitchen, bathroom, bedroom and a mudroom which led to an exit.

Outside of the exit were three cement steps that lead to a driveway. At the end of the driveway was a free-standing cottage with a bedroom, kitchen and bathroom.

The rehabilitation which maintained 131's historical features was necessary for the survival of the building. Interior and exterior walls were rotted, as was the roof and ceiling. Windows were leaking and electrical and plumbing required total replacement.
