## **RESOLUTION NO. 151-22**

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF DELRAY BEACH, FLORIDA APPROVING AN INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT WITH FLORIDA FISH AND WILDLIFE CONSERVATION COMMISSION FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE MANATEE PROGRAM; AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE ANY AMENDMENTS THERETO AND TAKE ALL ACTIONS NECESSARY TO EFFECTUATE THIS AGREEMENT; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the City of Delray Beach (City) is authorized to enter into agreements to provide services, programming and products in accordance with its Charter; and

WHEREAS, the City of Delray Beach desires to participate in the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission Manatee Program; and

WHEREAS, the program provides for additional marine law enforcement services within estuarine waters of the County during manatee season, which begins November 15th and ends the following March 31st; and

WHEREAS, the County will reimburse the City for these law enforcement services for on-water enforcement activity and approved court proceedings at agreed upon fixed rate; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission deems approval of this Resolution to be in the best interest of the health, safety, and welfare of the residents and citizens of the City of Delray Beach and the public at large.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF DELRAY BEACH, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> The foregoing recitals are hereby affirmed and ratified.

<u>Section 2.</u> The City Commission of the City of Delray Beach has reviewed and hereby approves this Agreement between the City and Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission.

<u>Section 3.</u> The City Commission authorizes the City Manager to execute any amendments thereto and take any other actions necessary to effectuate this Agreement.

Section 4. This resolution shall	become effective immediately upon adoption.
