2021-22 Accomplishments

- **Digital Inclusion Initiative**: The City partnered with School District of Palm Beach County (SDPBC) to install a WiFi Mesh Network system in the Northwest/Southwest neighborhoods. This system will provide free broadband access to 1,440 children or 770 households as identified by SDPBC
- · *COVID-19 Education Task Force*: The Education Task Force was created to study the effects of COVID-19 on education and find creative solutions for learning loss during the shut-down. Solutions included: launching a dedicated educational social media platform, teen listening tour, Mayor's Attendance Campaign, Pre-K book distribution and more
- *Girls Go Build*: The Education Division produced and organized a virtual year-long out-of-school program entitled "Girls Go Build". The program assisted middle school girls to explore careers in landscape architecture and the construction. The program included project-based learning and culminated in the construction of an outdoor wood deck at the Milagro Center with industry partner support
- · Campaign for Grade-Level Reading: The Education Division participated in numerous national webinars to learn about the effects of Covid-19 on learning, collected data and shared information and results with stakeholders to help communitywide efforts in learning loss recovery
- Census 2020: The City formed the Complete Count Committee with community stakeholders to implement a comprehensive Census 2020 communications campaign for the city, and facilitated numerous training sessions for adults and students to become ambassadors to support the City in their efforts to communicate the importance of being counted
