While patrolling around OSS Park I (#117-Jean Philippe Edouard) saw a man in a wheel chair around Atlantic Ave and NE 2nd Ave. As I continued on foot and glanced back over at the man just a few seconds after the first time I noticed him in his wheel chair- I saw that he had fallen out of his wheel chair face first onto the ground. I ran over to him where people had started to gather around, I put my gloves on and asked him if he was okay and if he needed help, and from the looks of things he was having a seizure. Someone in the crowd had already called the Paramedics while I was trying to keep him from shocking in his pool of blood kept him alert and talking. The Paramedics came within 6 mins and took him to the hospital for further treatment.
