**WHEREAS,** addiction is an American Medical Association defined disease and the stigma associated with addiction must be addressed so that no one feels shame or disgrace over a legal or illegal drug poisoning; and

**WHEREAS,** drug poisoning is the number one cause of injury deaths in the nation with an accidental drug overdose death occurring every 11 minutes, surpassing deaths from motor vehicle accidents or gun homicides; and

**WHEREAS,** according to the Center for Disease Control and Prevention, 52,404 people died in the United States as a result of a drug poisoning or 144 per day during 2015, the most current reporting year; and

**WHEREAS,** according to the Florida Medical Examiners Commission, there were 2,191 accidental deaths in the State of Florida during 2015 <u>caused</u> by a prescription drug poisoning; and

**WHEREAS,** according to Florida Agency for Health Care Administration, there were 4,926 hospital patients admitted for prescription opioid or heroin drug poisoning during just the first six months of 2016 in all of Florida, including 421 patients in Broward County, 562 in Palm Beach County, and 284 in Miami-Dade County; and

**WHEREAS,** by acknowledging all those who have been affected by prescription drug poisoning, we help the general public understand its effects on the community of Boca Raton, Florida; and

**WHEREAS,** the City of Delray Beach remains committed to raising awareness in order to combat stigma and educate our community about prescription drug poisoning prevention.

**NOW THEREFORE, I, Cary D. Glickstein,** Mayor of the City of Delray Beach, Florida do hereby proclaim August 31, 2017 as:
