Mike Burke, Chief Financial Officer with the Palm Beach County School District gave a presentation. He discussed the needs of the penny tax that was recently implemented. He described what the tax committee would do do and how the funds would be distributed throughout the schools in Delray Beach. He also explained what the impact would be county-wide. He went over his Power Point presentation. He stated there is a website that citizens can track progress of each project. The money is specific to capital improvement -- not teacher salary increases.

# 10.A. City Manager

Interim City Manager deJesus advised that he will defer the Caring Kitchen item to March 1st.

He commented that he received a Resolution from 164 Florida municipalities and nineteen counties for a lake and Everglades regional compact. Mayor Glickstein discussed the issues regarding the Christmas Tree.
