PROJECT: George Bush Boulevard Bike Lanes and Sidewalks from NE 2nd Avenue to A1A

Description: The 2015 application requested the installation of continuous bicycle lanes and sidewalks along George Bush Boulevard from NE 2nd Avenue east to A1A. The route provides connection for bicycle lanes existing on A1A all the way to the NE 2nd Avenue / Seacrest project that is currently under construction, as well as to Federal Highway and to the Swinton Avenue project. This assists with creating connectivity to meaningful destinations, including the Municipal Beach and to the downtown business district. Although awarded prior to the adoption of a Complete Streets Policy by the City Commission, this project includes all of the elements of a Complete Street including lighting and landscaping. No improvements to the George Bush bridge over the Intracoastal Waterway are included in this project.

Benefits: This project will facilitate bicycle and pedestrian travel in this corridor. The completion of this project supports City of Delray Beach pedestrian and bicycle mobility goals.

Risks: Staff and consulting engineers have raised concerns over several sections of this roadway that may have issues with narrow right of way and could create competing uses between car parking,

bicycling and pedestrian use. City Staff will remain engaged during the design process to ensure that any potential conflict is resolved.



Staff Recommendation: Move forward with this project.
