Description: The 2014 application requested the installation of bicycle lanes from Old Germantown Road to Lowson Boulevard. This is the second of a two-phase project. Phase 1 included the construction of bicycle lanes from Atlantic Avenue to Lowson Boulevard and was already constructed at the time of this application.

Benefits: This project will facilitate bicycle and pedestrian travel in this corridor. The completion of this project supports City of Delray Beach pedestrian and bicycle mobility goals.

Risks: Several issues have been raised by the FDOT in the initial review of this project design including the restricted right of way and the presence of a lift station within the median on Homewood Boulevard. Other concerns include interface at the Linton Boulevard intersection. FDOT has requested that City Staff perform additional public outreach activities in this corridor prior to construction of the project.



Staff Recommendation: Move forward with this project.
