WHEREAS, *Florida Highwaymen* use vivid colors to exhibit Florida landscape; such as crashing waves on windswept beaches, palm trees bent by the wind, majestic Royal Poinciana trees, moss-draped oak trees, red-orange sunsets, billowing clouds, and moonlit rivers; and

WHEREAS, *Florida Highwaymen* made a living selling their paintings along roadsides and out of the trunks of their cars; and

WHEREAS, *Florida Highwaymen* members were inducted into the Florida Hall of Fame in 2004; such as Curtis Arnett; Hezekiah Baker; Al "Blood" Black; Ellis Buckner; George Buckner; Robert Butler; Mary Ann Carroll; Johnny Daniels; Willie Daniels; Rodney Demps; James Gibson; Alfred Hair; Isaac Knight; R.L. Lewis; John Maynor; Roy McLendon; Alfonso "Pancho" Moran; Sam, Lemuel, and H. Harold Newton; Willie Reagan; Livingston "Castro" Roberts; Cornell "Pete" Smith; Charles Walker; Sylvester Wells, and Charles "Chico" Wheeler; and

WHEREAS, *Florida Highwaymen* members Curtis Arnett; R.L. Lewis; Isaac Knight, and Willie Reagan will be coming to the City of Delray Beach for pop up exhibits, living painting, and a panel discussion on Saturday, February 23rd and Sunday, February 24th.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Shelly Petrolia, Mayor of the City of Delray Beach, Florida, on behalf of the City Commission do hereby proclaim the 23rd and 24th of February 2019 as:

Florida Highwaymen Days
