REVISED INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY AND CRA FOR FUNDING GENERAL CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS - FY 2019-2020

Recommended Action:

Approve the revised Interlocal Agreement (ILA) between the City and CRA for funding for General Capital Improvement Projects within the CRA District for Fiscal Year 2019-2020.

Background:

The implementation of many of the projects contained in the Community Redevelopment Plan, particularly the public infrastructure projects resulting from the adopted Neighborhood and Redevelopment Plans, require a joint City/CRA effort. The typical arrangement involves the CRA funding all or a portion of a project, and the City's Engineering or other staff overseeing the bidding and construction processes.

Each year the City and CRA enter into an Interlocal Agreement to formalize the CRA's commitment to fund specific projects.

On October 1, 2019, the CRA Board approved an ILA between the City and the CRA for funding General Capital Improvement Projects within the CRA District for Fiscal Year 2019-2020. At that time, the projects list contained within the ILA was as follows:
