FIRST EXTENSION OF EMERGENCY DECLARATION DATED MARCH 28, 2020
("STAY AT HOME ORDER")

WHEREAS, Florida Governor Ron Desantis, in accordance with Article IV Section (1)(a) of the Florida Constitution and Chapter 252, Florida Statutes, promulgated Emergency Order 20-52 to declare a state of emergency in the State of Florida due to Novel Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19); and

WHEREAS, on March 28, 2020, City Manager George Gretsas issued "Emergency Declaration of the City of Delray Beach, Florida, Dated March 28, 2020" ("Order") requiring residents of the City of Delray Beach to stay home, establishing a curfew and limiting non-essential travel; and


WHEREAS, the Order is scheduled to expire on April 16, 2020; and


WHEREAS, the spread of COVID-19 continues to seriously affect the safety and security of the lives of the citizens of Delray Beach and the public at large; and

WHEREAS, the widespread effects of COVID-19 continue to require extraordinary and immediate actions by the City of Delray Beach in order to protect the public health, safety, welfare and renders an extension of the Order necessary.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, George Gretsas, City Manager of the City of Delray Beach, Florida, pursuant to Section 95.05(A) of the Code of Ordinances, do hereby extend the Emergency Declaration of the City of Delray Beach, Florida dated March 28, 2020 until 11:59 p.m. on Friday, May 1, 2020. All parts of the Emergency Declaration of the City of Delray Beach, Florida dated March 28, 2020 not expressly amended herein remain in full force and effect.
