

RESOLUTION NO. 140-20 - HURRICANE ISAIAS

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF DELRAY BEACH, FLORIDA, REPEALING RESOLUTION 138-20 IN ITS ENTIRETY PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 95 OF THE CITY CODE OF ORDINANCES; PROVIDING AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, on July 31, 2020, Interim City Manager Jennifer Alvarez declared a State of Emergency in response to Executive Orders issued by Palm Beach County and Governor Ron Desantis; and

WHEREAS, as the conditions arising from Hurricane Isaias presented a concern for the safety and security of the lives and property of the citizens of Delray Beach, the Municipal Beach was designated as off limits effective 12:01 a.m. on Saturday, August 1, 2020; and

WHEREAS, Hurricane Isaias has passed, and the City has completed its recovery efforts;


WHEREAS, a State of Emergency no longer exists in the City of Delray Beach and the designation of the Municipal Beach is no longer necessary; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF DELRAY BEACH, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1. The State of Emergency previously proclaimed on July 31, 2020 within the City of Delray Beach, Florida is hereby terminated.

Section 2. The City Manager, or designee, is hereby directed to reinstate normal operations and procedures for all City operations and business as a State of Emergency no longer exists.
