## **RESOLUTION NO. 40-21**

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF DELRAY BEACH, FLORIDA, GRANTING AN APPEAL AND APPROVING A WAIVER TO SECTION 5.3.1(A) OF THE LAND DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS TO ALLOW FOR A REDUCTION OF THE REQUIRED RIGHT OF WAY DEDICATION FOR THE PROPERTY LOCATED AT 816 PALM TRAIL, AS MORE PARTICULARLY DESCRIBED HEREIN; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the City of Delray Beach, Florida ("the City") received an application for 10 Waivers to the Land Development Regulations (2021-040) associated with the property located at 816 Palm Trail (the "Property"), from Interloc, LLC ("Applicant/Property Owner"), requesting the dissolution of a unity of title and demolition of the existing structure and the construction of 11 new single-family homes located at 816 Palm Trail; and

WHEREAS, Section 5.3.1(A) of the City of Delray Beach Land Development Regulations ("LDR") states that Right-of-way dimensions and dedications, whether public or private, shall be consistent with the Mobility Element of the Comprehensive Plan as outlined in Table MBL-1, "Street Network and Classification and Improvements", which provides for coordinated rights-of-way dedications with the Florida Department of Transportation and Palm Beach County; and

WHEREAS, Table MBL-1 in the Comprehensive Plan indicates that ultimate right of way width of an alley is 20 feet; and

WHEREAS, LDR Section 5.3.1(A)(3) states that when development is adjacent to an existing or planned street, the development shall be responsible for providing one-half of the ultimate right-of-way or such portion of the ultimate right-of-way which is yet undedicated and which is on that development's side of the ultimate right-of-way center line. In situations where there are unusual topographic features, greater or lesser dedications may be required; and

WHEREAS, the ultimate Right-of-Way north of 816 Palm Trail, Lot 9 Block 5, is 15 feet as depicted in Exhibit "A", attached hereto and incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, consistent with Table MBL-1 in the Comprehensive Plan and LDR Section 5.3.1(A)(3), a 2.5-foot dedication is required; and

WHEREAS, the applicant requests a reduction in the required right of way dedication from 2.5 feet to 0 feet so that no dedication is required; and

WHEREAS, the requested reduction is not supported by the City Engineer; and

WHEREAS, on January 28, 2020, the City's Development Management Services Group met and did not support the request to reduce the right-of-way dedication; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to LDR Section 5.3.1(A)(7)(a), an appeal may be made to the City Commission when a reduction request is not supported by the City Engineer; and

WHEREAS, reductions in the required right-of-way width may be granted if the Commission finds that:

- 1. requiring full dedication would constitute a hardship in this particular instance and that all required improvements will be provided in a manner which will not endanger public safety and welfare, and
- 2. that acceptable, alternative provisions are made to accommodate features which would otherwise be accommodated within the right-of-way e.g., alternative drainage systems, alternative pedestrian walkways, alternative on-street parking, etc.

WHEREAS, the City Commission granted the appeal and considered the waiver request to LDR Section 5.3.1(A) at a quasi-judicial hearing on February 9, 2021.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF DELRAY BEACH, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The foregoing recitals are hereby incorporated herein by reference and are approved and adopted.

<u>Section 2</u>. The City Commission makes positive findings that requiring full dedication would constitute a hardship in this particular instance and that all required improvements will be provided in a manner which will not endanger public safety and welfare and that acceptable, alternative provisions are made to accommodate features which would otherwise be accommodated within the right-of-way e.g. alternative drainage systems, alternative pedestrian walkways, alternative on-street parking, etc.

Section 3. The City Commission grants the appeal and approves the request to reduce the right-of-way dedication to 0' and finds that no dedication is required.

Section 4. The City Clerk, or designee, is directed to send a certified copy of this Resolution to Thomas F. Carney, Jr., 135 SE 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue, Suite 202, Delray Beach, FL 33483.

Section 5. All resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict herewith shall be and hereby are repealed.

<u>Section 6.</u> This Resolution shall be effective upon adoption.
