Dear Ms. Kinlen:

The Palm Beach County Traffic Division has reviewed the **Starbucks Atlantic Avenue** Traffic Impact Statement, revised February 19, 2021, pursuant to the Traffic Performance Standards in Article 12 of the Palm Beach County Unified Land Development Code (ULDC). The project is summarized as follows:

<b>Municipality:</b>	Delray Beach
<b>Location:</b>	SEC of Atlantic Ave and Military Trail
<b>PCN:</b>	12-42-46-13-00-000-7070 & 12-42-46-13-30-001-0000
<b>Access:</b>	As existing <u>(As used in the study and is NOT an approval by the County through this letter)</u>
<b>Existing Uses:</b>	General Retail = 70,308 SF Pharmacy w/ DT = 13,215 SF Drive-In Bank = 5,850 SF
<b>Proposed Uses:</b>	Replace existing drive-in bank with: Coffee/Donut Shop + DT = 2,500 SF
<b>New Daily Trips:</b>	732
<b>New Peak Hour Trips:</b>	82 (39/43) AM; -3 (-1/-2) PM
<b>Build-out:</b>	December 31, 2025

Based on our review, the Traffic Division has determined the proposed development does not have significant peak hour traffic impact (as defined in PBC TPS) on the roadway network and therefore, meets the Traffic Performance Standards of Palm Beach County.

Please note the receipt of a Traffic Performance Standards (TPS) approval letter does not constitute the review and issuance of a Palm Beach County Right-of-Way (R/W) Construction Permit nor does it eliminate any requirements that may be deemed as site related. For work within Palm Beach County R/W, a detailed review of the project will be provided upon submittal for a R/W permit application. The project is required to comply with all Palm Beach County standards and may include R/W dedication.

No building permits are to be issued by the City after the build-out date specified above. The County traffic concurrency approval is subject to the Project Aggregation Rules set forth in the Traffic Performance Standards Ordinance.
