FUNDING AGREEMENT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2021-2022 BETWEEN THE DELRAY BEACH COMMUNITY REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY AND GREATER DELRAY BEACH CHAMBER OF COMMERCE, INC.

THIS AGREEMENT is made thisday of	, 2021 by
and between the DELRAY BEACH COMMUNITY REDEVELOPMENT	AGENCY, a
public body corporate and politic, duly created and operated pursuant to	Chapter 163,
Florida Statutes, (hereinafter referred to as "CRA"), and GREATER DELF	RAY BEACH
CHAMBER OF COMMERCE, INC. a Florida not-for-profit corporation,	, (hereinafter
referred to as the "CHAMBER").	

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, increasing economic development within the Delray Beach Community Redevelopment Area is essential to the Community Redevelopment Plan; and

WHEREAS, the CRA Board finds that the services and programs provided by the CHAMBER further the goals and objectives of the CRA as contained in the Community Redevelopment Plan, and are in the best interest of the CRA; and

WHEREAS, the CRA will provide funding to the CHAMBER, pursuant to the terms and conditions of this Agreement, in order to assist the CHAMBER with activities that address the goals and objectives contained in the CRA's Community Redevelopment Plan, and the needs and priorities defined by the CRA in the CRA's "A-GUIDE: Achieving Goals Using Impact Driven Evaluation," for which the CHAMBER has applied and which have been awarded according to procedures specified in the A-GUIDE; and

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WHEREAS, the CRA finds that this Agreement serves a municipal and public purpose, is consistent with the Community Redevelopment Plan, and conforms with the requirements of Florida law.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises herein contained, the parties hereby agree as follows:

- 1. The recitations set forth above are hereby incorporated herein by reference.
- 2. The term of this Agreement shall commence upon execution by both parties. The Agreement shall continue in full force and effect until September 30, 2022.
- 3. The CRA shall provide funding to the CHAMBER in an amount not to exceed Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00) (the "Funding Amount"). The funds are to be used by the CHAMBER to support its organizational operations, and for the purpose of supporting the Small Business Development Center and community programs, in conformance with the programs/projects within the CRA district specified in the A-GUIDE documents. Quarterly payments in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) shall be made by the CRA to the CHAMBER. The CRA has the right to withhold the quarterly payment until receipt of documentation from the CHAMBER, and until the CRA receives all additional information from the CHAMBER that the CRA deems necessary, in its sole and absolute discretion, to analyze the CHAMBER's financial position.
- 4. Prior to the issuance of quarterly payments by the **CRA** for Fiscal Year 2021-2022, as specified in this Agreement, **CHAMBER** shall provide quarterly program budget and narrative reports to the **CRA**. **CHAMBER** shall use the form, attached as

Exhibit "A", in order to document the CHAMBER's expenditure of funds and the CHAMBER's progress towards outcomes projected in the Goals & Outcomes Report and Budget. The CHAMBER will also be required to submit a Quarterly Balance Sheet. In addition, the CHAMBER may be required to present a quarterly update to the CRA Board upon request. The program budget and narrative reports shall be provided to the CRA no later than January 31, 2022, April 30, 2022, July 31, 2022 and October 31, 2022. In addition, the CRA may request that the CHAMBER provide any additional information that the CRA deems necessary in order to fully evaluate the CHAMBER's performance and financial status. The payment will not be released to the CHAMBER until the CRA receives the report and any additional information requested.

- 5. In the event the **CHAMBER** does not expend funds in accordance with its approved A-GUIDE funding application, attached as Exhibit "B", the **CRA** shall provide written notice to the **CHAMBER** of such deficiency(ies), and the **CHAMBER** shall have fourteen (14) days from receipt of the notice to cure the deficiency(ies) to the satisfaction of the **CRA**. Should the **CHAMBER** fail to cure such deficiency(ies) to the satisfaction of the **CRA**, the **CRA** shall be entitled to recoup the portion of the **Funding** Amount allocated and/or already disbursed to the **CHAMBER**, under the terms of this Agreement. The **CRA** shall have sole and absolute discretion with respect to the determination as to whether **CHAMBER** is expending funds in accordance with its approved A-GUIDE funding application.
- 6. The **CHAMBER** shall insure that all publicity, public relations, advertisements and signs recognize the **CRA** for the support of all activities conducted with the funds provided by the **CRA**, including sponsorship of holiday activities. The

use of the **CRA** logo is permissible, but all signs or other advertising materials used to publicize **CRA** funded activities must be approved by the **CRA** prior to being utilized. Upon request by the **CRA**, the **CHAMBER** shall provide proof of the use of the **CRA** logo as required by this paragraph for projects funded pursuant to this Agreement.

- 7. Both the CRA and the CHAMBER agree that the CHAMBER shall at all times act as an independent contractor in the performance of its duties under this Agreement Accordingly, the CHAMBER shall be responsible for the payment of all taxes including Federal and State taxes arising out of the CHAMBER's activities in accordance with this Agreement including by way of illustration but not limitation, Federal income tax, Social Security tax, Unemployment Insurance taxes, and any other taxes or business license fees as may be lawfully required.
- 8. The CHAMBER hereby gives the CRA, through any authorized representative, upon reasonable notice, access to and the right to examine all records, books, papers, or documents relating to the funding provided pursuant to this Agreement. The CHAMBER hereby agrees to maintain books, records and documents in accordance with accounting procedures and practices which sufficiently and properly reflect all expenditures of funds provided by the CRA under this Agreement in accordance with the Florida Public Record Laws as provided in Chapter 119, Florida Statutes, as may be amended from time to time. The CHAMBER hereby agrees that if it has caused any funds to be expended in violation of this Agreement, it shall be responsible to refund such monies in full to the CRA, or if this Agreement is still in force, any subsequent request for payment shall be withheld by the CRA.

- 9. No prior or present agreements or representations with regard to any subject matter contained within this Agreement shall be binding on any party unless included expressly in this Agreement. Any modification to this Agreement shall be in writing and executed by the parties.
- 10. The validity of any portion, article, paragraph, provision, clause, or any portion thereof of this Agreement shall have no force and effect upon the validity of any other part of portion hereof.
- 11. This Agreement shall be governed by and in accordance with the Laws of Florida. The venue for any action arising from this Agreement shall be in Palm Beach County, Florida.
- 12. If the CRA determines pursuant to the A-GUIDE Logic Model and Evaluation Plan that the CHAMBER is not achieving the stated impacts and outcomes, or is otherwise not furthering the CRA's goals and objectives, the CRA shall provide written notice to the CHAMBER of such deficiency(ies), and the CHAMBER shall have fourteen (14) days from receipt of the notice to cure the deficiency(ies) to the satisfaction of the CRA. Should the CHAMBER fail to cure such deficiency(ies) to the satisfaction of the CRA, the CRA Board has the right to void the Agreement immediately after delivery of written notice to CHAMBER. The CRA's Board shall have sole and absolute discretion with respect to the determination as to whether CHAMBER is filling the CRA's goals and objectives.
- 13. Notices pursuant to this Agreement shall be given by deposit in the custody of the United States Postal Service, postage prepaid, addressed as follows:

14. <u>PUBLIC RECORDS</u>. **CHAMBER** shall comply with the applicable provisions of Chapter 119, Florida Statutes. Specifically, **CHAMBER** shall:

- (a) Keep and maintain public records required by the **CRA** to perform under this Agreement.
- (b) Upon request from the **CRA**'s custodian of public records, provide the **CRA** with a copy of the requested records or allow the records to be inspected or copied within a reasonable time at a cost that does not exceed the cost provided in this chapter or as otherwise provided by law.
- (c) Ensure that public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements are not disclosed except as authorized by law for the duration of the Agreement term and following completion of the Agreement if the **CHAMBER** does not transfer the records to the **CRA**.
- (d) Upon completion of this Agreement, transfer, at no cost, to the public agency all public records in possession of the **CHAMBER** or keep and maintain public records required by the public agency to perform the service. If the contractor transfers all public records to the **CRA** upon completion of the Agreement, the contractor shall destroy any duplicate public records that are exempt or confidential and exempt from public records disclosure requirements. If the **CHAMBER** keeps and maintains public records upon completion of the Agreement, the contractor shall meet all applicable requirements for retaining public records. All records stored electronically must be provided to the public agency, upon request from the **CRA**'s custodian of public records, in a format that is compatible with the information technology systems of the public agency.
