Pauline Moody, 614 NE 8th Avenue, Boynton Beach, commented she was glad the City will have a new City Manager from Tamarac. She expressed her concern that the video shown of the officers who were being honored were both illegal and inappropriate. She inquired about the construction and when would it be completed because of the garbage all over and she wanted to know why the City would allow this.

Ann Stacey Wright, 225 SW 7th Avenue, Delray Beach, expressed her disappointment with the Commission, specifically in regards to the NW/SW Set Community. She feels the City Commission shows a lack of respect for the Set Community - as they are trail blazers, stakeholders and residents. She also expressed her disappointment in the way that the sale of the land was handled.

Jim Chard, 401 SE 4th Avenue, Delray Beach, told the Commission that he was the Chairman of the Chamber of Commerce for the Girls Go Build Program and thought that it was a wonderful model for the City. He complimented Janet Meeks on a job well done.

Alice Finst, 707 Place Tavant, Delray Beach, echoed the comments made by Pauline Moody in regards to the construction on Atlantic Avenue and I-95 taking forever.

Bob Victorin, 120 S. Ocean Blvd., Delray Beach, President of the Beach Property Ownership, commended the Commission on their choice of Mr. Michael Cernech. Secondly, he read a letter regarding restoring the City Beach and dunes to their natural beauty and the need to be protected. Vice Mayor Shirley Johnson made the following comment:

• She mentioned that there are health issues within the annexations and expressed that it should be looked at - like unhealthy water, etc.
