Recommended Action:

Change the qualifying period to the first fourteen (14) business days in December immediately prior to the calendar year in which the election is to be held.

Background:

The Palm Beach County Supervisor of Elections has requested that all municipalities within the county move up their qualifying period to provide sufficient time to send absentee ballots to overseas

citizens in accordance with Section 101.61, Florida Statutes.
