APPROVAL TO ACCEPT THE FY 2018 ASSISTANCE TO FIREFIGHTERS GRANT (AFG) # EMW-2018-FO-05865 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$585,454.54 FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY FOR THE FIRE RESCUE DEPARTMENT.

### **Recommended Action:**

Staff recommends the approval to accept grant funding from the FY 2018 Assistance to Firefighters Grant.

### **Background:**

The City of Delray Beach Fire Rescue Department has been awarded a Department of Homeland Security Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) in the amount of \$585,454.54 to purchase self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA).

The Delray Beach Fire Rescue Department has a need to update its aging SCBA and accessories. Total cost for replacement is estimated at \$1,011,000. This AFG will provide much needed funding towards that purchase. As a condition of the grant, the City is required to contribute non-Federal funds equal to or greater than 10 percent (10%) of the Federal funds awarded, or \$58,545.46 for a total approved budget of \$644,000.

### **City Attorney Review:**

Approved as to form and legal sufficiency.

### **Funding Source/Financial Impact:**

This is a 90/10 matching grant agreement of federally awarded funds from the Department of Homeland Security/FEMA. The financial impact to the City of Delray Beach is limited to the \$58,545.46 (10%).
