Background:

This agenda item relates to establishing the City's Pride Intersection as a permanent memorial. If approved, this resolution would establish the intersection as a permanent memorial thereby giving it a

protected status under Florida Law. Florida Statute 806.135 provides that any person who willfully or maliciously destroys a memorial commits a felony of the second degree.
