DISCUSSION AND DIRECTION REGARDING THE CITY OF DELRAY BEACH'S 2023 STATE LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES

Recommended Action:

The City Commission is asked to discuss state legislative issues with our lobbyist, Mat Forrest of Ballad Partners to set legislative priorities for the 2023 Florida Legislative Session.

Background:

Mat Forrest of Ballard Partners will be in attendance to discuss key issues expected to be raised during the 2023 Florida Legislative Session. Mr. Forrest will work with the Commission to formulate the City's legislative priorities for the session. In addition, staff will present a list of potential projects for which to seek funding from the legislature during the session.
